

40 Years: Remembering the Heroes of The Beirut Barracks Attack

Sunday 23 October 1983 06.22: A 19-ton truck, filled with an estimated 6 tons of TNT, entered a public parking lot adjacent to the headquarters of the 8th Marine Regiment's 1st Battalion. The truck circled the parking lot and picked up speed, ran through a 5-foot high wire barrier, and drove between two guard posts. The Marines on duty had no time to react. Seconds later, the morning quiet was shattered by a massive explosion.

In that moment, 241 Heroes were lost. 220 Marines. 18 Sailors. 3 Soldiers. The Battalion Landing Team of 1/8, the ground element

of the 24th Marine Amphibious Unit (MAU), had deployed to Lebanon as part of a multinational peacekeeping force.

Four days after the bombing, President Ronald Reagan addressed the nation and recounted an experience General Paul Kelley, Commandant of the Marine Corps, had while visiting critically injured Marines in an Air Force Hospital.

> "I'll let General Kelley's words describe the incident. He spoke of a 'young Marine with more tubes going in and out of his body than I have ever seen in one body."

> "He couldn't see very well. He reached up and grabbed my four stars, just to make sure I was who I said I was. He held my hand with a firm grip. He was making signals, and we realized he wanted to tell me something. We put a pad of paper in his hand -and he wrote `Semper Fi.'

"Well, if you've been a Marine or if, like myself, you're an admirer of the Marines, you know those words are a battlecry, a greeting, and a legend in the Marine Corps. They're Marine shorthand for the motto of the Corps -- 'Semper Fidelis' -- always faithful.

"General Kelley has a reputation for being a very sophisticated general and a very tough Marine. But he cried when he saw those words, and who can blame him?

"That Marine and all those others like him, living and dead, have been faithful to their ideals. They've given willingly of themselves so that a nearly defenseless people in a region of great strategic importance to the free world will have a chance someday to live

lives free of murder and mayhem and terrorism. I think that young Marine and all of his comrades have given every one of us something to live up to.

"They were not afraid to stand up for their country or, no matter how difficult and slow the journey might be, to give to others that last, best hope of a better future. We cannot and will not dishonor them now and the sacrifices they've made by failing to remain as faithful to the cause of freedom and the pursuit of peace as they have been.

"I will not ask you to pray for the

dead, because they're safe in God's loving arms and beyond need of our prayers. I would like to ask you all -- wherever you may be in this blessed land -- to pray for these wounded young men and to pray for the bereaved families of those who gave their lives for our freedom.

"God bless you, and God bless America."

National Bylaws – AGSM, Inc. Representative Board Appointment Amendment

At our 2023 National Convention, an amendment passed to our National Bylaws. Under Article IV, Section 10, "Members of American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., who desire to represent American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., on the boards of another organization of any type must submit a written request to be appointed as the representative of American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., to such board. The National Executive Board will review the request and, if approved, submit a written endorsement for such member to serve on the board as our official representative. American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., will in no way be liable for any adverse actions taken by such member in their service on such board, nor any adverse actions taken by the board should they become the subject of litigation."

As you are asked to serve on the boards of other organizations as official representatives of AGSM, Inc., please contact National President Pam Stemple at <u>president@americangoldstarmothers.</u> <u>org</u> and provide the details of the opportunity. The NEB will then review the request and provide you with a letter of endorsement. This would not apply in situations where someone is appointed to a board because they are a "gold star mother," only in situations where you are specifically appointed because you are a member of AGSM, Inc.

If you are currently serving on a board or committee as a representative of AGSM in your area, please send that information to Pam. You are exempted from the newly passed requirement because it was pre-existing for those current appointments. However, we will keep that information on file in case we are contacted. Many times, we receive calls looking for resources in different geographic areas, and this will be a good starting point for us. If you have any question about an appointment to any board or group, please feel free to reach out to the NEB for further information and clarification. Thank you for all you are doing for AGSM in your community!

Who is this "Robert" and why are there "Rules of Order"?????

Robert's Rules of Order is a guidebook developed to ensure that meetings are fair, efficient, democratic and orderly. It allows all members to voice their opinions in an orderly manner so that everyone in the meeting can hear and be heard. The following tips and reminders will ensure a successful and productive meeting:

- Create an agenda and follow it to keep the group moving toward its goals.
- Let all members wishing to speak have an opportunity to speak once before allowing anyone to speak a second time.
- When discussions get off-track, gently guide the group back to the agenda.
- Model courtesy and respect and insist that others do the same.
- Help to develop the group's understanding of parliamentary procedure by properly using motions and points of order.
- Encourage members to present motions positively rather than negatively.
- Give each speaker your undivided attention.
- Don't allow emotions to rule discussions.
- Understand that the group's consensus is the final authority of the group.

Parliamentary Procedure is the best way to get things done at your meetings, but it will only work if you use it properly.

American Gold Star Manor: A History of Serving Gold Star Mothers







At the 10th Annual National Convention of American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., led by then AGSM President Eleanor Boyd, a plan was developed to build a national memorial home for dependent and pensioned members of American Gold Star Mothers, Inc. This was the birth of the American Gold Star Manor. Built as a "temporary war housing" project by the federal government, the Truman Boyd Manor was constructed to house defense workers and armed forces personnel. In 1953, the 93 acres of Truman Boyd Manor were purchased by American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., and over time, the hastily built war structures were replaced with more suitable structures. Today, the American Gold Star Manor is a clean, quiet, safe and affordable senior retirement community in Long Beach, California. It provides an independent living environment for Gold Star Mothers, Fathers, Veterans and other eligible seniors. Situated on a 25-acre park-like setting with sumptuous trees, lawns, flowers and gardens, the community features a community recreation hall, social programs, life enrichment programs, recreation facilities, pool and spa, picnic areas, game room, computer room and meditation chapel.

Today, the Home and Manor is one the largest donors to American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., helping us sustain and continue our mission. The National President and First Vice President serve on the Home and Manor Board of Directors, helping guide the Manor as it continues to fulfill its promise to aid those who are among the most needy. There are two ways the Manor can assist with housing costs. Gold Star Mothers receive housing priority to move into the property in Long Beach. In 2021, in response to a growing need across our nation, the Manor established the American Gold Star Monor Housing Assistance Grant to help Mothers who do not live at the Manor. Eligibility for the Manor Housing Grant include:

- \cdot Must have Gold Star parent status
- Low-income household/family (no more than 300% above the federal poverty threshold)
- Total assets below \$70,000
- \cdot Be experiencing a hardship or emergency

Housing Assistance Grants are limited to one award per household per year (and no more than three consecutive years). To learn more about the Manor and explore its opportunities, visit www.goldstarmanor.org.

New Freedom Farm

New Freedom Farm is a nonprofit community farm located in Buchanan, Virginia. The farm exists to aid Veterans and first responders with post-traumatic stress disorder, substance use, traumatic brain injury and other conditions by using the therapeutic activity of interacting with equines, farming and peer-to-peer support. The end goal is to empower individuals and help them heal by realizing their efforts and contributions.

Founded and operated by Lois Dawn Magill, a forensic nurse examiner and Navy Veteran, and her team, New Freedom Farm heals heroes through horses by offering Veterans and first responders the space and confidence to develop deep friendships through equine activity and gentling, fostering physical, emotional, and spiritual health, assisting individuals with reintegration into civilian life.

When Fritz and her husband, Mitchell, bought the 13-acre property a few days before Christmas 2015, the farm was a shabby, muddy, weedy mess. However, just like the Veterans she hoped to one day help, Fritz saw the potential for recovery. What she envisioned with the creation of New Freedom Farm was a soothing, pastoral environment in which service members could talk freely about their service over a horse, with little pressure to fit the therapeutic mold. The hope was that these horses would help veterans escape the hurt and







open up to others with shared experiences. American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., is proud to make New Freedom Farm the recipient of our National Fundraiser for 2023-2024. For more information on the programs at New Freedom Farm, visit their website, https://www.newfreedomfarm.org/
